## Religions to issue a moral call for carbon-free laws

## To the editor:

Thank you for Tom Relihan's article on the Quakers' inspiring, consciousness-raising pipeline walk. Religious groups are enormously important at inspiring people to change because religions foster connectedness to community, inspire adherents to work for a greater good and urge moral action.

Citizens' Climate Lobby is an organization of volunteers dedicated to creating the political will to enable Congress to pass carbon-free legislation. We want the proceeds returned to the public so low- and middle-income consumers won't be hurt by price increases. We want companies that profit from producing fossil fuels to pay for the emissions their products generate — paying for the garbage one causes is the morally right thing to do.
