However, faculty efforts shouldn't be restricted to science departments. All UC researchers should be called on to teach the public about every aspect of global warming. Historians should document, and relentlessly remind the public, about the government's RICO case against Big Tobacco, and how fossil fuel industrialists are engaging in the same organized fraudulent behavior today. Sociologists, political scientists and journalism professors should document the rise of social movements with parallels to today's climate change movement.

Medical researchers should hammer home the negative human health implications of fossil fuel pollution, and the implications of higher temperatures for death rates in America.
